The Schurz Library's Lincoln Room is home to one of 40 chairs that were purchased in 1861 by President Lincoln for use in the State Dining Room in the White House. Numerous pieces of furniture and accessories at the White House were purchased from the fashionable Philadelphia retailer, Wm. H. Carryl & Bros., including the massive rosewood bed known as the "Lincoln Bed." This beautiful chair, as well as numerous Lincoln memorabilia, and a lovely dining room set were donated in 1974 by Robert and Louise Christianson, owners of the Christianson Furniture Store located in Mishawaka.

From the Dean





Lincoln Exhibit

For six weeks starting in March, "Lincoln: The Constitution and the Civil War" will be on display on the 5th floor of the Schurz Library. This large exhibition explores how Lincoln used the Constitution to confront three intertwined crises of the war—the secession of southern states, slavery and wartime civil liberties. The traveling exhibition and tour was developed by the National Constitution Center and the American Library Association Public Programs office, with generous support from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).
