Schurz Library host for Boys and Girls Clubs of America Art Exhibit

The Schurz Library is the host location for the Midwest Regional Art Exhibit for the Boys and Girls Clubs of America in conjunction with national sponsor L'oreal for Kids. The Boys and Girls Clubs of St. Joseph County are the host agency. The display, which consists of 61 pieces of children's art, is on the 5th floor of the library and will be available during library hours until March 23. Winning pieces will be forwarded to the Boys and Girls Clubs of America national conference.

A. Lavonne Brown Ruoff to speak March 9th

"The Survival of Tradition: An Introduction to Native American Literatures," will be the title of a lecture by A. LaVonne Brown Ruoff on March 9, 2000 at 7:30 p.m. in the 5th floor atrium of the Schurz Library. Ms. Ruoff is interim director of the D'Arcy McNickle Center for American Indian history at Newberry Library, Chicago. She is also professor emerita of English at the University of Illinois at Chicago, where she developed the Native American Studies program. Ms. Ruoff has been active in the study and scholarship of Native American Literature for most of her career, and has lectured widely on the subject to various audiences. A reception sponsored by the Friends of the Schurz Library will follow the lecture.

Historical Photographs display

The Schurz Library lobby and 5th floor will soon be the site of a traveling display titled: "Back Home Again: FSA Photographers in Indiana, 1935-43." This is an exhibit of photographs taken in Indiana in the years 1935-1943. Included are works by some of America's finest photographers: Dorothea Lange, Arthur Rothstein, Carl Mydans, Russell Lee and John Vachon. These images document the difficult times endured by Hoosiers during the Great Depression and World War II. Included are scenes from Brown and Martin Counties, resettlement projects near Vincennes and Decatur, the Great Flood of 1937, people at work and play, transportation, farm auctions and the impact of World War II. The Hoosier state experienced a balance of industry and agriculture, of urban and rural life, which seemed to mirror the nation. The Farm Security Administration (FSA) photographs of Indiana provide a striking memory of what Indiana and the nation were like 50 years ago.

The works will be on display from April 11 through May 15. This event is cosponsored by

the Schurz Library and the IUSB Department of History.

Learning Resources Center offers new binding service

The LRC now offers a new method of binding documents. This new process binds and titles documents from 3-350 pages in seconds, with no punching or drilling of pages. You may choose from covers in clear, black, red and blue with binding tape in black, white and red, then select a variety of colored ink for printing a title on the spine. The cost is \$2.00 including cover, tape and spine printing. The LRC staff in Greenlawn Hall room 111 will assist you in creating a professionally finished document in minutes.

Serving Elkhart

The Schurz Library has expanded its services to the Elkhart Center to include Library Instruction and some Interlibrary Loan services. All interlibrary loan forms may be completed in Elkhart, submitted to Gail Wood-Ward, and are then sent to the Schurz Library for processing. Photocopies of articles and ERIC documents are delivered to the Elkhart Center. Elkhart students must still come to the Schurz Library to borrow books.
