1/2	Scrapbook, 1957 to 1976	Contains a variety of newspaper clippings, correspondence, programs, and ephemera mostly from the year 1976, but with additional content as early as 1957. Includes a business card from the Rev. Martin Luther King, Sr., Pastor of the Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, Indiana's 1976 Senior Citizen of the Year nominees, thank you letter from Valley Bank and Trust Company, proclamation for Fair Housing Month, a thank you letter from Real Services, program for a Race Relations Benefit Dinner (held at the La Salle Hotel), thank you letter from Congressman John Brademas, thank you letter from the State of Indiana Commission on the Aging and Aged. Includes information on LaSalle Park Homes, the Northwest Site (behind LaSalle High School), Northeast Site (1300 block of South Bend Avenue), and the Chapin Street Site (formally J.D. 1/5	Congressional Record, 1972	Contains a copy of the United States Congressional Record from October 14, 1972. Additionally contains a photocopy of a portion of the Congressional Record from September 21, 1973, along with a pre-printed note from U.S. Congressman John Brademas. The article refers to an address by Representative Brademas to the Lyndon B. Johnson Citizens Award Dinner in Baltimore, Maryland, regarding race relations. Representative Brademas served as a U.S. Representative from Indiana's 3rd Congressional District, encompassing most of northeast Indiana including the cities of Fort Wayne and Goshen.	CRHC.DSON.005
1/6	Scrapbook, 1976 to 1977	Contains photographs, newspaper clippings, and ephemera of or related to Jesse Dickinson mostly from the years 1976 to 1977, with one newspaper clip from 1941. Includes newspaper clipping of pouring metal at Bendix, Father's Day photographs, Dickinson Intermediate School, Senior Citizens of the Year for Indiana.	CRHC.DSON.006

1/8	Scrapbook, 1977 to 1979	Contains newspaper clippings mostly from the year 1979, with a few from as early as 1977. Most (though not exclusively) were published in the <i>South Bend Tribune</i> on a wide array of topics relevant to African Americans and the African American community. Includes Muhammad Ali's official retirement, Senator Birch Bayh meeting with local black leaders at the Hansel Center, an invitation from Muhammad's Masjid #31 (South Bend), Black Culture quiz, Congressional Record: Senate Bill making Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday a legal public holiday. Also includes a Penthouse Interview with Robert Shelton (Imperial Wizard of the United Klans of America), Crisis Magazine Donald Woods: "Daedalus of Civil Rights," a poem written by Jerome Fleischer to commemorate Dr. Martin Luther King's Birthday, a letter from Jesse Dickinson asking residents to donate to the needy during the holidays (typed on Hansel Center stationary). Includes an article from the <i>South Bend Tribune</i> about the "mysterious" Oliver family, "Awards Given for Historic Preservation," "Welfare cost \$40 Billion a year," letter to the <i>South Bend Tribune's</i> "Voice of the People" series written by Jesse Dickinson. 1/13	Scrapbook, 1979	Contains newspaper clippings from the year 1979, mostly (though not exclusively) published in the South Bend Tribune, on a wide array of topics relevant to African Americans and the African American community. Includes, "U.S. Blacks suckered by Carter symbolism," "Senate Committee Backs Welfare Grant Increase," "Sambo's (restaurant) Chain Name Approved in Toledo," "Housing Plans Outlined," "Wolfson Named to TV Panel," "School Discipline Cases Show High Black Ratio." 1/15	Scrapbook, 1982	Contains newspaper clippings from the year 1982, mostly (though not exclusively) published in the <i>South Bend Tribune</i> , on a wide array of topics relevant to African Americans and the African American community.	CRHC.DSON.013
1/16	"Three Ways," no date	Story written by Jesse Dickinson about the lives of three boys who lived or are living near Hering House. Three typewritten pages, extremely fragile.	CRHC.DSON.014
1/17	Program, Jesse Dickinson's Plantation Singers, no date	Program, presumably from a performance of "Jesse Dickinson's Plantation Singers," although no date nor location are given. It lists the participants (including Mr. Dickinson, Dr. Bernard Streets, Ms. Georgia Ward Bryant, Mr. O.B. Flowers, and Mr. George Toodle) and text describing the performance. While the text used to describe the performance uses traditionally racial language (e.g. "The rhythm and character of songs of this colored race are a relic and inheritance, combining joy, superstitions and religion."), it's worth noting that in the second to last paragraph, it mentions that "Each member of the group has a college degree or has done work to be applied on a degree." Note: This was originally part of the CRHC collection and not part of the donation by Coleridge Dickinson. It was moved to the Dickinson Collection from the Small Collection in March 2015.
